## Billing Information

Utility bill payments are due by the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month. Late notices will go out on the 16<sup>th</sup> of each month. All accounts unpaid as of 8:00am on the 20<sup>th</sup> of each month will be disconnected. A reconnection fee of \$50.00 for each utility (gas/water) will be charged in addition to full payment of the utility bill to have services restored.

## Recycling

The recycling trailer will be parked in front of the school on the first and third Thursdays each month. If the 1st is not on a Monday or Tuesday then the trailer will be here the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of the month.

### Drop-Off Recycling Options in Emporia

Many items can be recycled at drop-off locations throughout Emporia. Some common items listed below.

- Books to the Public Library
- Clothing, housewares, furniture, working electronics and small appliances to organizations such as The Salvation Army or Goodwill.
- Plastic sacks to Walmart or Dillon's
- Yard waste to the City landfill/Transfer station
- Hazardous waste to facility at 3000 W. South Ave.

## Community Building Rental

All reservations must be made in person or in direct phone conversation with city hall staff. No emails or after hour phone messages will be accepted. The application and the deposit must be received within **one (1) week** of making the reservation or the reservation will be cleared from the calendar. Building rental payment must be received prior to the event. Up to four hour rentals are \$50, over four is \$100.

All require a \$50 possibly refundable deposit. For an additional \$50.00 deposit, a big screen TV is available for use when renting the building.

## Reading Community Building Tornado Shelter Information!

**After** the sirens have sounded, the only doors in the Community Building that will automatically unlock are the two doors on the **north** side of the building. From there you can enter the tornado shelter. The east doors and the south doors to the building **do not** unlock automatically.

Remember: ONLY the north doors will unlock and they will not unlock until **AFTER** the sirens have sounded.

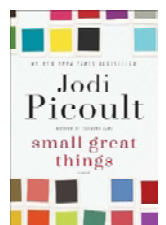
### Barbara's Book Club

Ruth Jefferson is a labor and delivery nurse at a Connecticut hospital with more than twenty years' experience. During her shift, Ruth begins a routine checkup on a newborn, only to be told a few minutes later that she's been reassigned to another patient. The parents are white supremacists and don't want Ruth, who is African American, to touch their child. The hospital complies with their request, but the next day, the baby goes into cardiac distress while Ruth is alone in the



nursery. Does she obey orders or does she intervene? Ruth hesitates before performing CPR and, as a result, is charged with a serious crime. Kennedy McQuarrie, a white public defender, takes her case but gives unexpected advice: Kennedy insists that mentioning race in the courtroom is not a winning strategy. Conflicted by Kennedy's counsel, Ruth tries to keep life as normal as possible for her family—especially her teenage son—as the case becomes a media sensation. As the trial moves forward, Ruth and Kennedy must gain each other's trust, and come to see that what they've been taught their whole lives about others—and themselves—might be wrong.

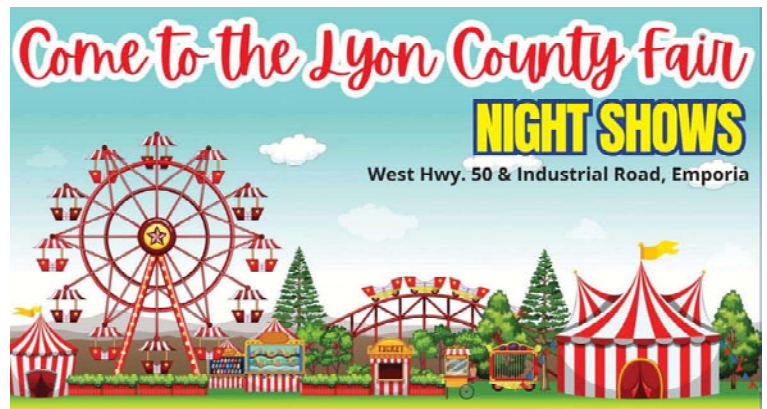

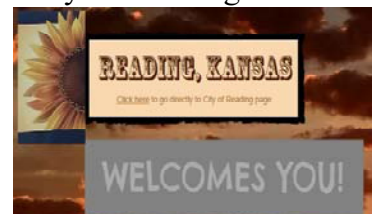

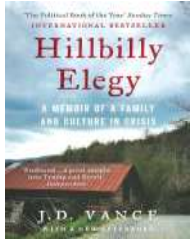

Hillbilly Elegy is a passionate and personal analysis of a culture in crisis—that of white working-class Americans. The disintegration of this group, a process that has been slowly occurring now for more than forty years, has been reported with growing frequency and alarm, but has never before been written about as searingly from the inside. J. D. Vance tells the true story of what a social, regional, and class decline feels like when you were born with it hung around your neck.

The Vance family story begins hopefully in postwar America. J. D.'s grandparents were "dirt poor and in love," and moved north from Kentucky's Appalachia region to Ohio in

the hopes of escaping the dreadful poverty around them. They raised a middle-class family, and eventually one of their grandchildren would graduate from Yale Law School, a conventional marker of success in achieving generational upward mobility. But as the family saga of Hillbilly Elegy plays out, we learn that J.D.'s grandparents, aunt, uncle, and, most of all, his mother struggled profoundly with the demands of their new middle-class life, never fully escaping the legacy of abuse, alcoholism, poverty, and trauma so characteristic of their part of



America. With piercing honesty, Vance shows how he himself still carries around the demons of his chaotic family history.

A deeply moving memoir, with its share of humor and vividly colorful figures, Hillbilly Elegy is the story of how upward mobility really feels. And it is an urgent and troubling meditation on the loss of the American dream for a large segment of this country.
